



RESOURCE CONSERVATION AND RECOVERY ACT MANAGER

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Harris Environmental Group, Inc. is seeking a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Manager for Harris Environmental Group, White Sands Missile Range (WSMR), New Mexico. WSMR is an active US Army post located in southern New Mexico, researching and developing advanced missile weapon systems. WSMR Army command requires complete compliance with State, Federal and US Army environmental and safety regulations. The RCRA manager position supports multiple WSMR directorates, all of which create typical and atypical hazardous waste streams. The WSMR test facility is regulated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), New Mexico Environment Department (NMED), Federal Executive Orders and US Army environmental policy and guidelines.

Position Requirements:

- A minimum of ten (10) years' experience and accompanying knowledge of hazardous waste handling and hazardous waste management protocols.
- A two (2) year resident's course associated with any environmental fields at a college or technical institute.
A four-year degree can reduce the 10-year experience requirement.
- Must hold a 40-hour Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) certificate and have a current 8-hour certificate.
- Familiarity with Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) parts 239 through 282.
- Ability to properly interpret federal, state, and local environmental regulations and provide guidance to both government and private personnel for hazardous waste management, waste disposal activities, and remediation procedures.
- Applicant may be subject to a security investigation and must meet eligibility requirements for access to classified information.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

- Evaluate, recommend, and establish SAP requirements.
- Manage and supervise the daily operations of all SAP waste/inspections, building decontaminations and 90-Day Hazardous Waste Storage Facility in accordance with all Federal, State, local and US Army regulations.
- Create and submit in a timely manner, waste profiles for multiple waste types, handle, package and prepare RCRA samples for shipment.
- Read, understand and relate all chemical sampling analysis results from analytical laboratory to current RCRA regulations.
- Understand and actualize hazardous waste transportation requirements.
- Collect field waste samples for analysis and document disposal activities
- Ability to plan, organize, coordinate, schedule, prioritize, assign and evaluate the work of RCRA tasked employees.
- Provide training to personnel in hazardous waste management requirements.
- Must be capable of being trained and certified to applicable Federal, State and local regulations.
- Must be capable of performing remediation (biological and chemical) activities over the entire WSMR range; at easily accessible sites and at remote sites.
- Must be capable of working while wearing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), usually Level C
- Occasional overnight and extended stay work may be required.
- Ability to lift 50 pounds may be required.
- Ability to work in inclement and/or extreme and/or extreme weather.
